Assessment specifications:

Ākonga must be capable of consistently meeting compliance requirements in a construction trade.

Compliance requirements for construction trades refer to adherence with warranties, liabilities, New Zealand Standards and/or consenting relevant to work undertaken. Consenting processes relate to both national and local legislation and codes.

It is not a requirement to be a Licenced Building Practitioner (LBP) to carry out our restricted building work; it is required that work requiring consent is supervised and signed off by a LBP.
