Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of working with others in a construction environment for familiar or consistent construction tasks.

A construction environment may be any environment involved in the modification, construction or maintenance of buildings, structures, or infrastructure assets.

Evidence must include collaboration provided by candidates and may be in the form of a brief written statement, toolbox minutes with important points highlighted to commercial standards.

Evidence must include communication with workmates, and non-peer workmates, and may include other people on site.
