OUTCOME STATEMENT/TE TAUĀKI Ā-HUA

Strategic Purpose statement/ Te rautaki o te tohu

The purpose of this qualification is to provide the drainlaying sector with people who are skilled as drainlaying tradespersons and ready to apply for registration as a licensed drainlayer under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 2006.

This qualification is targeted at people working in the drainlaying industry and who can fulfil the requirements to obtain a limited trainee authorisation issued by the Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainlayers Board.

Graduates will have the skills and knowledge required to safely carry out all drainlaying work within the scope of an authorised drainlayer. A licensed drainlayer can lay, alter, reconstruct, extend, repair, and open up drains and associated traps and connect drains up to and away from wastewater treatment stations.

Graduate Profile/Ngā hua o te tohu

Graduates of this qualification will be able to:

- Apply practical knowledge of installation and maintenance to complete work with foul water drainage systems.
- Apply practical knowledge of installation, commissioning, and maintenance to complete work with stormwater drainage systems.
- Apply practical knowledge of installation, commissioning and maintenance to complete work with trade waste drainage systems.
- Apply practical knowledge of on-site wastewater and effluent treatment and disposal systems to install pumps for drainage systems.
- Apply practical knowledge of subsoil, gradient, and excavation considerations to complete excavations and reinstatement.
- Apply practical knowledge of drainage drawings and specifications to interpret and produce drawings and records of as-built work.
- Apply the legislative responsibilities of a licensed drainlayer to drainlaying work.
- Work with consideration of other trades and related services on site and practice ethically.
- Apply material science and selection, trade physics, and environmentally sustainable considerations to work with drainage systems.
- Apply safe working practices and environmentally sustainable considerations to complete work with drainage systems.

Graduates of the optional strand in Onsite Wastewater Treatment System Installation will also be able to:

Install, commission, and maintain on-site wastewater treatment systems to job specifications.
