Assessment specifications:

To achieve this standard, the supervisor will confirm that they have observed ākonga working appropriately and effectively as a member of the rigging team for rigging operations.

Effectively work refers to communication and teamwork skills that support successful rigging team outcomes.

Evidence for this standard is through a combination of observed skills assessment in the workplace and a portfolio of evidence capturing the naturally occurring evidence.
