# Outcome statement/Te tauāki ā-hua

### Strategic Purpose statement/ Te rautaki o te tohu

The purpose of this qualification is to provide the crane industry with individuals who may be employed as crane operators or dogmen for a range of crane tasks in dynamic and variable workplaces.

The qualification strands recognise the differing requirements of specialist crane operations.

The crane industry, and the building and construction industry, in particular, will benefit from having people who are qualified in crane operation or load guidance for a range of crane types.

Graduates will be capable of working in a self-managed capacity and may be supervising others.

#### Graduate Profile/Ngā hua o te tohu

Graduates of this qualification will be able to:

- Take the lead for lifting operations, including the establishment of an exclusion zone.
- Plan lifts for regular and irregular loads which could also include complex lifts.

Graduates of the **Advanced Dogman strand** will also be able to:

- Complete calculations and use the results to sling irregular loads using appropriate lifting equipment.

#### Graduates of the Crawler Crane strand will also be able to:

- Configure a crawler crane to lift and place regular and irregular loads, and complete post-lift requirements to ensure the crane is safe.
- Operate a crane with a crane-lifted work platform to enable personnel access in a commercially competent manner.

#### Graduates of the Mini-crawler Crane strand will also be able to:

- Prepare a mini-crawler crane for lifting.
- Sling, lift and place regular and irregular loads, and travel the crane.

#### Graduates of the **Mobile Crane strand** will also be able to:

- Prepare a mobile crane for lifting.
- Lift and place regular and irregular loads. Complete post-lift requirements to ensure the crane is safe.
- Prepare the crane for travel.
- Operate a crane with a crane-lifted work platform to enable personnel access in a commercially competent manner.

#### Graduates of the Non-Slewing Articulated Crane strand will also be able to:

- Configure a non-slewing articulated crane for lifting.
- Lift, travel, and place regular and irregular loads. Prepare the crane for travel.
- Operate a crane with a crane-lifted work platform to enable personnel access in a commercially competent manner.

#### Graduates of the **Tower Crane strand** will also be able to:

- Prepare a tower crane for lifting.
- Lift and place regular and irregular loads, and complete post-lift requirements to ensure the crane is safe.
- -Operate a crane with a crane-lifted work platform to enable personnel access in a commercially competent manner.

#### Education Pathway/ Ngā huarahi mātauranga

This qualification builds on the New Zealand Certificate in Cranes (Level 3) with strands in Dogman, Pendant or remote controlled Overhead / Gantry Crane, Self-Erecting Tower Crane, Truck Loader Crane [Ref: 3730].

Graduates of the Crawler Crane, Mini Crane, Mobile Crane, Non-Slewing Articulated Crane, and Tower Crane strands may progress onto the New Zealand Certificate in Cranes (Advanced Crane Operation) (Level 5) [Ref: 3732].

Alternatively, graduates of all strands may progress to Leadership and Management qualifications in the business arena.

Employment, Cultural, Community Pathway/ Ko ngā huarahi ā-mahi, ā-ahurea, ā-whānau, ā-hapū, ā-iwi, ā-hapori anō hoki

Graduates of this qualification will have the skills and knowledge to work in specialist crane operator or dogman roles in areas such as the building industry, heavy construction industry, marine environments, and on high rise building sites.
